'AUSTRALIA DAY 2024' WUGULORA MORNING CEREMONY WALUMIL LAWN, BARANGAROO RESERVE

ACCESSIBLE VIEWING AREA



This information fact sheet is for guests who register for the accessible viewing area for the WugulOra Morning Ceremony at Walumil Lawn, Barangaroo Reserve, which takes place from 7:30am to 8:30am.

The intention of this accessible viewing area is to prioritise the accessible requirements of our guests who use a mobility device like a wheelchair or power-chair but also acknowledge that a number of guests may also have other mobility, sensory, cognitive or medical requirements beyond wheelchair access that may also require seating in the accessible viewing area. We do our best to accommodate any guest who identifies with any of these accessibility/medical considerations at our event.

Entry Point

The easiest way to enter the site it via Towns Place off Dalgety Road or Hickson Road. Follow the signage to the Walumil Lawn, where you will be greeted by our friendly staff who will escort you to the seated accessible viewing area. Getting There

Barangaroo Reserve is accessible to all visitors, with lifts to all levels, accessible amenities and accessible car parking on site. For more information on accessibility,

Walking: The most enjoyable way of arriving is on foot from Wynyard Station to Towns Place, which will take approximately 13 minutes.

Alternatively, follow the harbour sidewalk from Circular Quay, under the Sydney Harbour Bridge to Walsh Bay and enter the reserve at Towns Place. Those heading to the reserve from Wynyard or Town Hall should use Kent St, via Margaret St and enter at either Argyle Place or Towns Place.

By car: There are two accessible street parking bays on Towns Place, close to the entry to the carpark.

Parking: Care Park operate a car park beneath the Reserve, accessed via Towns Place. It provides eight accessible parking spaces on level B1. Please see Care Park website here for more details.

Train: Wynyard and Circular Quay are both approximately 1.1km. Travel via Wynyard is a little quicker and involves using Wynyard Walk tunnel.

Bus: The 324 and 325 buses go directly to Barangaroo Reserve departing from Town Hall and route 311, runs between Central Station and Argyle Street.

Taxi: The Hickson Road entrance to Barangaroo Reserve is recommended if arriving by taxi or being dropped off/picked up by private vehicle.



Accessible toilets

In addition to the amenities within The Cutaway, other toilet facilities, including two ambulant and one accessible cubicle, are located near the Towns Place entrance.





Auslan Interpreting / Closed Captioning

There will be Auslan interpreters on site to facilitate communication for those that require this service, who will also interpret in Aboriginal language. NITV / SBS will broadcast WugulOra and closed captioning will be available for TV viewers.
